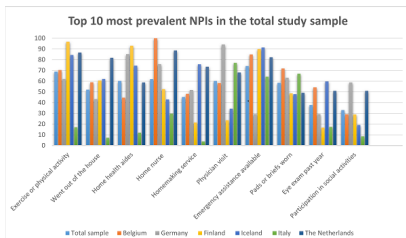
Webinar Wednesday 9 Nov: Future of Homecare

Prevalence of non-pharmacological interventions in Homecare

Work Package 6 of the I-CARE4OLD project aims to predict the impact of non-pharmacological treatments on the modification of health trajectories. To prepare for this, we first investigated the prevalence of non-pharmacological interventions in both Homecare and Long term care facilities settings based on existing data from IBenC, a previous EU study. This provided us with more insights in the current utilization of non-pharmacological interventions in various European countries.

The findings - including *substantial differences between and within European countries* - were presented at the Dutch National Gerontology Congress in October.
